Objective: Practicum students will gain up to 120 internship hours will a local business during the summer months of June and July 2024. Through the internship program students will work in careers primarily in the Business and Industry Academy that focus on planning, organizing, directing, and evaluating business functions essential to efficient and productive business operations. Students will also have the opportunity to design and learn about the development and use of engines and machinery, test computer related equipment for commercial and industrial use, and work in various departments at local hospitals. These skills and experiences will prepare students for high wage, high demand job opportunities locally and statewide.

Activities/Strategies: Student participants will be identified through a selection process with the employer by May 2024. Students will participate in an interview process and receive a written and verbal communication of the awarded internship. Students will have the opportunity to work Monday-Thursday up to four hours per day at the internship site. At the conclusion of the internship program students will have gained valuable skills to use in their practicum level courses. Student performance will be evaluated by employers who will provide feedback to students. The CTE Summer Internship Coordinator will work with local employers to finalize internships and maintain consistent communication with employers and record student evaluations. Additionally, the coordinator will work closely with CTE teachers to select and train students in order to prepare them for their upcoming job placement.

The Career and Technical Education Summer Grant will allow Chapel Hill ISD CTE department to expand work-based learning(WBL) opportunities for students entering their senior year in high school. Students are enrolled in introductory and advanced level CTE courses that prepare them for postsecondary education and/or industry based, certifications. Any student that meets the prerequisite requirements with room in their schedule can participate in the WBL opportunity within their pathway during the school year. Throughout the year students participate in job shadowing but very few students can commit to the internships due to financial hardships. Many students obtain jobs outside of their career path in order to secure longer work hours for extra income. The CTE Summer Grant would allow students to work in their program of study and receive a competitive stipend to supplement their income. Transportation costs are also a barrier for many students that must have transportation to sites off-campus; thus limiting participation. CHISD works to create more opportunities within the district and campus to support those students and can continue this opportunity through the summer grant. Local employers are also able to employ more students throughout the summer months which increases the number of students who participate in work-based learning experiences. Lastly, many students are involved in extra curricular activities and cannot commit to internships throughout the year. Students are faced with schedule conflicts, which ultimately force them to choose between their career pathways and extracurricular activities. During the summer months, students have a more flexible schedule to allow participation in internship opportunities.
