Raymondville ISD will implement a Grow Your Own program with the use of high school courses in the Career & Technology Education workforce pathway of Education and Training. The mission of this program is to recruit local students to learn about the teaching profession and to develop their knowledge and skills for success as a future education in Raymondville ISD. The mission of this program aligns with the needs that currently exist in the area of teacher shortages within the ESC Region One area. Raymondville ISD is located in a small rural community that is difficult to attract and retain quality educators each school year. The 2022-23 TAPR report shows an 11% teacher turnover rate and 31% of teachers have one to five years experience. This program will help Raymondville ISD to address the teacher turnover rate to attract and retain a quality teacher workforce from within the community and create a talent pipeline of future educators with a heart for the area we serve.

A project manager will be assigned to oversee and manage the implementation of the program. The PM will have a Master's degree in an education related field, experience as a school administrator, with at least three years teaching experience, principal or administrator certification, experience mentoring new teachers, and managing grant funded programs. This is a proposed position that will be hired upon notice of grant award. The Program Manager will coordinate the implementation of the program with the CTE Education and Training teacher and will be supported by the high school principal, Guidance Counselor, and the district's Director of Curriculum and Instruction and the Director of Special Programs. To ensure the program is successful a committee of stakeholders will be created to provide insight, accountability, and leadership during monthly check-in meetings throughout the school year. The counselor will provide additional management and oversight to ensure fidelity of implementation of required courses across the curriculum. The counselor has experience implementing new career pathways for high school students, enrolling, tracking, and providing academic support to ensure students persist and achieve their college and career goals. The principal will also provide administrative support to ensure the master schedule is developed to facilitate the course sequence.

The district's leadership team will utilize a research-based equitable recruitment of teachers model for the E&T courses. Recruitment and selection will begin with scheduling an information meeting for teachers to learn about the specific program requirements for a position as an E&T teacher. Teachers will be asked to complete an application, submit letters of recommendation, provide copies of evidence of student performance on assessments and/or benchmarks, submit a resume and letter of interest, and sign an agreement to meet all program requirements to receive a stipend. Scoring will be based on the following factors: 1) Evidence of success in the classroom through student achievement data and evaluations, 2) Demonstrated passion for the teaching profession, 3) Outstanding recommendations from the principal and other supervisors, 4) Diversity that reflects the student population, 5) Past experience mentoring student-teacher interns and/or new teachers, 6) Participation in professional development and delivering professional development, 7) Positive relationships with students, and 8) Commits to remaining in the district for at least three years for receiving a stipend. Priority will be given to Master Teachers, National Board Certified Teachers, and teachers that scored an overall rating of Distinguished or Accomplished on T-TESS.

RISD is committed to supporting the success of all participants and candidates receiving stipends. 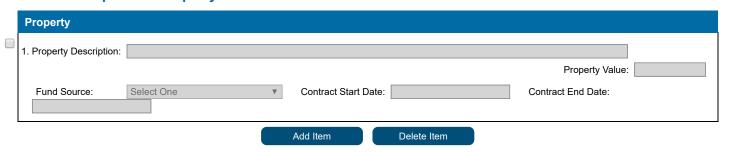
