San Angelo ISD is committed to building strong and stable teacher pipelines from within our own community. As part of our Career and Technology Education (CTE) program, the district sees more students participating in the pathway. The grant would allow the district to expand opportunities for participating students and staff. San Angelo ISD has already begun hiring students who have participated in the program in high school after graduation and actively visits and supports students and staff in the program. As we continuously seek opportunities to improve program outcomes and ensure that participants are well-prepared to succeed as teachers, the grant will provide additional resources to support our efforts to address teacher shortages and incentive teaching as a career. San Angelo ISD has a local university. The decreasing number of traditional university-based clinical teachers continues to strain the teacher pipeline. In the fall of 2023, there were fewer than 20 clinical teachers for the district, and in the spring of 2024, there were a total of 29. The need to build interest while students sit in their own high school seats is more important than ever. SAISD has two high schools, and both campuses offer Principles of Education Training, Instructional Practices in Education and Training, and Practicum in Education and Training. Overall District support is imperative as students stay in the community and return to teach on campuses where they were once students.

B. Qualifications and Experience for Key Personnel

Primary project personnel to be involved in the implementation and delivery of the program include the following: Director of Career and Technical Education (CTE) will serve as LEA grant manager. Deputy Superintendent will serve in program implementation. This is an existing staff member who directly works with both high schools and all teachers involved in the education and training pathway. Campus principals at both Central High School and Lake View High School were in place in the 2023-2024 school year. Both work closely with district leadership and the Director of CTE. These leaders fully support and endorse the classes and grow your own program. High School Counselors at both high schools will have new counselors for the 2024-2025 school year. However, both high schools will also have returning counselors who are well-trained in endorsements and pathways. Additionally, district staff provides ongoing support from the Director of CTE and the Director of Counselors. CTE paraprofessionals-both high schools have one paraprofessional assigned to their staff to assist CTE advising. CTE Teachers-both high schools have Education & Training Program of Study teachers of record during the 2023-24 school year that meet the certification requirements and will be returning. These staff members are master teachers with successful track records with students of various ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds.

The goal of SAISD's grow-your-own program is to recruit future educators by building interest in teaching among our very own high school students through high-quality course offerings. As part of the middle school to high school transition, all SAISD students participate in a CTE Fair to see the various course offerings outside of core classes and regular electives. Students then use Xello software with their school counselors and teachers and complete interactive career, personality, and learning style assessments to help them better understand their unique interests, skills, and strengths. Each engaging assessment encourages reflection, helping students connect who they are with a relevant career option. This helps counselors, students, and parents make decisions for the best pathway for students and has helped our district expose more students to education and training courses. Through these course offerings, students will be provided with a high-quality curriculum and hands-on learning experiences to learn how to be effective communicators, collaborators, creators, and critical thinkers. These four "C" are components of SAISD's learner profile. As part of SAISD's talent management strategy, the district has an educator profile directly aligned to the learner profile. To create future-ready graduates who can be successful post-secondary, the district looks for educators who uphold a collaborative culture, building relationships, demonstrate resiliency, exhibit

compassion, and design authentic, engaging work that fosters profound learning to support a dynamic learning environment that is a safe, responsive, and adaptable. In recruiting such teachers, the district uses its educators to tell their stories of why they chose SAISD. The district has a dedicated portion of its website featuring stories. The district also uses the tagline and hashtags for social media: Our People Make the Difference and Difference Makers. Both high schools have active TAFE groups. The district would create a future teacher center to further promote future educators and the profession.

D. Performance and Evaluation Measures

Performance measures for our program include increasing the number of completers in the educational and training pathway, with students obtaining an industry-based Educational Aide I certificate. Students working to complete their degree and teacher certification at our local university or through online universities will be offered employment with the district as instructional paraprofessionals, special educational paraprofessionals, or child-care staff in our daycare facility. Employment rates will be tracked by the percentage of graduates employed and enrolled in post-secondary education after graduation and in cohorts for degree completion. Teacher effectiveness will be assessed through classroom observations and student surveys.

The proposed budget will meet the needs and goals of the program through payroll costs for 2 Education & Training teacher stipends dispersed over the 2 year grant timeline; one stipend for teacher with Masters degree teaching dual credit, one stipend for teacher without Masters degree teaching Education & Training courses not for dual credit. It will also provide \$4,000 for Education & Training field site teacher stipends, one for each high school campus. Additionally, student transportation between campuses, TAFE and Rise & Teach event/conference participation, fees, and travel costs, and substitute coverage to allow teachers to participate in CTSO activities will be paid with the \$10,000 proposed budget. Classroom curriculum resources including supplemental texts, online resources, and instructional materials will be purchased within the proposed budget of \$13,000. Recruitment efforts through the Future Teacher Planning Center will be funded through the proposed budget of \$6,500.

To build strong, stable, and diverse pathways from SAISD to address teacher workforce needs, the LEA is building capacity within their own staff by offering certified teachers the opportunity to complete an application to serve as field site teacher or Education & Training classroom teacher. Criteria is built in to the application to intentionally target highly successful master teachers with experience in positively working with diverse populations in appropriate instructional settings. Additionally, criteria includes areas of involvement in student organizations, district initiatives promoting strong student relationships including participation in Capturing Kids Hearts, and successful teaching experiences as evidenced through TTESS evaluations.

The goal of SAISD's grow-your-own program is to recruit future educators by building interest in teaching among our very own high school students through high-quality course offerings. We will support teachers through high quality curriculum, instructional materials, and professional learning. Coaching support will be on-going and available through regular and intentional Professional Learning Communities. Release time to "work on the work" is built in to the District calendar as Instructional Planning Days. Teachers and students will be supported by campus and district administration to ensure highest levels of support are offered. This allows our students to witness a high quality program and build interest in the teaching profession.
