Leander ISD is committed to growing future educators as stated in our LISD District Improvement Plan. Our focused goal is to "Attract, grow, and retain a collaborative community of first-rate employees who are empowered to meet the needs of each and every student. Through this goal we are focused on expanding and enriching recruitment and retention of high quality, diverse candidates. Through our efforts we have been exploring options for residency programs and recognize the need for a structured approach to a sustainable program.

Our goal is for this grant is to support the employment of a staff member dedicated to working with partner universities to develop a program that meets the needs of the district, university and ultimately provides an in-depth learning experience for future educators in our district.

As the landscape of education changes, we know it is essential to create systems that support new teachers. In LISD we saw 14% of our new to profession teachers, who resigned at the end of the 21/22 school year, report they planned to leave the profession. This grant will support our efforts to ensure new teachers have the best possible foundation to be successful in education, thereby keeping them in the profession.

LISD will partner with TWU as well as other possible partnerships with other universities to be identified at a later date, as well as technical assistant to complete development of a sustainable strategic staffing plan to address ongoing teacher shortage issues. LISD is currently experiencing vacancies across all levels with higher needs in special education, elementary and identified hard to fill positions. We are currently seeing an increase in alternative certification teachers and new to profession teachers entering the workforce who are not adequately prepared for the challenges of teaching. We are committed to ensuring our students have the best possible teacher supporting their learning journey in LISD. To that end, our goal is to develop a sustainable residency model that provides a full year of experience with a highly effective mentor for our residents, supporting deeper learning, building their capacity to be successful their first year. They will also support other instructional needs in the district by potentially serving as skilled substitutes, high quality intervention for struggling students, tutoring, small group core instruction support, and providing mentorship for stuggling students. Various models and options will be explored to best support the resident and student learning at the identified campus.

We are committed to growing our own talent pool and a residency program that provides a full year working with highly effective mentors, learning the curriculum, participating in PLC's and giving more experience from the first day to the last is a key to continuing growth of our grow our own talent, which also supports higher retention rates.

LISD will work closely with TWU and technical assistance entity to commit the first year to a deep dive into current systems, data, budget, goals and needs in order to develop a plan for implementation and sustainability. This will start with the hiring of a Teacher Residency Program Specialist. This position will work closely with TWU as well as other identified universities and technical support entity to develop our residency program. Our goal is for the strategic plan to include data monitoring, progress monitoring and continuous improvement of the system built into the master plans. At the conclusion of the grant, it is anticipted this position will remain within HR, working closely with recruitment, supporting new hires, residents, student teachers, and teacher retention efforts within the district. As an HR Dept we have been talking about the need for a position like this to continue our efforts toward our goal "Attract, grow and retain a collaborative community of first-rate employees who are empowered to meet the needs of each and every student".

We have found TWU to be strong advocates for development of highly effective teachers and they have found LISD to be a supportive and resourceful partner. We look forward to growing this partnership through the development of a residency program. We will also be exploring other university partnerships in order to broaden our outreach and support of new teachers.
