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Summary of Program (Focus Area 1)

Mount Calm ISD is a rural school district in Central Texas. For this grant we hope to partner with neighboring school districts, either Penelope ISD and Hubbard ISD, to provide a CTE Summer Bridge program to students from both school districts. All three districts face similar challenges due to our rural setting and small district size. Our mission is to create a supportive learning environment that empowers students by providing a learning experience that fosters creativity and innovation. The district accepts responsibility for preparing students to be college and career ready in a changing world. Our district leaders and school board members are committed to offering CTE Statewide Programs of Study which are aligned with regional labor needs and workforce projections.

At this time, our need is to provide access and equity for students to accelerate learning opportunities to enter and complete programs of study and complete an Industry Based Certification related to Culinary Arts and Applied Agriculture Engineering. Many of our students will not be able to qualify for College and Career Readiness points through any other means. This will be beneficial to our students and our district's overall success.

Our proposed summer program will allow students to work in their pathways over the summer months. Many student schedules do not have access to the classes needed to allow for the two class periods needed to complete a statewide program of study and graduate with a distinguished diploma.

We will use these grant funds to provide a five to six weeks summer program allowing students to take a course in, Applied Agricultural Engineering Pathway, or Culinary Arts Pathway. The program will target students who are entering 8th grade and above from Mount Calm ISD, Penelope ISD, and Hubbard ISD who are interested in continuing and completing their statewide program of study and receive their industry based certification in that field. We will target enrolling 20 students. This number will be dependent if we partner with one or both districts.

The CTE Summer Program will be focused on student outcomes and evaluated based on several performance measures and data points. We will collect data on the demographics of students who enroll in, participate in, and complete the program including grade level, race/ethnicity, and economically disadvantaged status, as well as whether they have been identified as in need of special education services. We will utilize other data collected for PEIMS to provide analysis numbers for district leadership, our school board, and TEA grant reporting requirements.

Our goal for the summer is to provide students with the opportunity to to be introduced to workplace competencies and make academic content accessible by providing hands-on context. We will help students focus on their studies and know where they are headed throughout and after high school, and offer opportunities for upward career mobility. In addition, we would like this opportunity to introduce students to nontraditional occupational fields.

Within this program, we are focused on setting the foundational academic, and technical skills, knowledge, and training necessary to succeed in future careers and to become

lifelong learners. We will Introduce students to workplace competencies and make academic content accessible by providing it in a hands-on context. Our goal is to help students focus on their studies and know where they are headed throughout and after high school, and offer high-quality opportunities for upward career mobility. CTE programs provide a clear pipeline of talent and unique opportunities for students to engage in rigorous coursework, internships, apprenticeships, and other meaningful on-the-job experiences. We will use this opportunity to help fill the opportunity and skills gaps that increased during the pandemic, and introduce high-quality opportunities for education and training beyond high school that can lead to economic opportunity for our students.

The CTE summer bridge program will be focused on student outcomes and evaluated based on several performance measures and data points. We will collect data on the demographics of students who enroll in, participate in, and complete the program including grade level, race/ethnicity, and economically disadvantaged status, as well as whether they have been identified as in need of special education services. We will utilize other data collected for PEIMS analysis number for district leadership, our school board, and TEA grant reporting requirements.

Our belief is that CTE inspires and motivates students to develop many of the skills that employers most need across job industries. Our goal in the summer bridge program is to create life-long learners who are college and career ready. It is our goal to support students in their technical skill proficiency aligned to a chosen career field and pathway, and the ability to apply both academic and technical learning in the context of a career. Our mission for the summer program is for at least 20 students to earn concentrator/completor status in a TEA statewide program of study. Additionally, at least 75% of these students will complete a TEA approved Industry Based Certification in their program of study by August 1, 2023. We will provide additional services to students who need additional support, such as tutoring and mentoring sessions with the course teacher.

There will be formative quizzes and summative assessments delivered during each course, in addition to a pre-test, mid-course test, and post test. Students will also engage in project based learning instruction to give students the opportunity to develop knowledge and skills through engaging projects set around challenges and problems they may face in the real world. These assessments and approaches will be used to guide instruction, determine intervention needs, and evaluate TEKS mastery for course credit. The data will be both qualitative and quantitative and provide insight on whether our goals, learning objectives and student outcomes were successfully met.

Students will show mastery of the course by earning course credit and earn an Industry Rased Cortification upon

	Grant funding will be used to pay supplemental payment to the CTE teachers to teach the summer sections in the pathway of study Applied Agricultural Engineering or Culinary Arts, and supplies for the courses. Grant funding will also help with student and teacher travel and explore career opportunities and job sites within the region. This will allow our rural students to expand their knowledge and see real world application in Agricultural Engineering and Culinary Arts. Grant money will also allow the district to purchase CTE supplies and equipment that are otherwise unavailable to a small district with little Perkins funding available. The supplies and materials are essential creating real world job experiences in both Agricultural Engineering and Culinary Art. Traveling to jobs sites and witnessing their education field in action can help motivate our students in their post high school career.

The primary goals of the program are the following: increase interest and enrollment in these programs of study at Mount Calm ISD; accelerate students' ability to complete a program of study in high school; pass/earn an Industry Based Certification and increase college and career awareness and preparedness in students.
