Tornillo ISD is a small rural district whose mission is to empower our learning community to live their purpose by honoring values and beliefs for a holistic postsecondary journey. Being a small rural district, we are limited in resources in many areas including our Information Technology Program of Study. We currently have one instructor that will be teaching AP Computer Science A for the first time beginning 2022-2023 school year. Our district would like to increase the capacity of our IT Program of Study by affording our students the opportunity to have access to as many IT courses as possible to include AP Computer Science Principles. The funding will allow for our district to provide our instructor with the opportunity to receive the necessary training to teach AP CSP at our high school. Additionally, it would provide our district the opportunity to purchase a classroom curriculum and equipment. This course would give our students the opportunity to explore additional programming languages and aligning with our mission to provide a holistic postsecondary journey by earning college credit with a qualifying AP score.

As mentioned, we currently have one instructor that will be teaching AP Computer Science A for the first time beginning 2022-2023 school year. Our district would like to increase the capacity of our IT Program of Study by affording our students the opportunity to have access to as many IT courses as possible to include AP Computer Science Principles. This course would give our students the opportunity to explore additional programming languages and aligns with our mission to provide a holistic postsecondary journey by earning college credit with a qualifying AP score. This course would be included in our IT Program of Study available to all students. Our district promotes our CTE courses to include our IT courses to all students beginning at the Jr. High School level. All students will be presented with information about this course the benefits that are included within.

Again, because we are a small district with only one high school, our district will select our current IT instructor as the one to teach the Computer Science Principles course. Our district currently offers stipends to our CTE teachers for teaching four or more CTE courses in which CSP will be included. TISD will provide our teacher with the opportunity to receive the necessary training and PD to successfully teach our students.

Currently we are exploring the option of using the curriculum provided by Project Lead The Way. Their Computer Science Principles curriculum is recognized and endorsed by the College Board. Our instructor will have the opportunity to attend the training provided by PLTW during the upcoming 2022-2023 school year or during the summer of 2023. PLTW currently offers an online 80-hour training over a 10 week period.

The Project Lead The Way curriculum aligns with and works closely with the College Board to align with the AP Computer Science Principles exam requirements and framework. The curriculum includes units which cover Algorithms, Abstraction, Internet, Data Diligence, Computing Innovations, and allocated time for working on the College Board Performance Task. Students will require the use of a computer lab which our high school has assigned for our IT courses.

5. Describe how students will be supported in selecting and succeeding in the AP CSP course. How does this course support the student's program of study or graduation plan? The LEA must include a plan for ensuring that students take and pass the AP CSP exam.

As mentioned, this course would be included in our IT Program of Study and will be available to all students. Our district promotes our CTE courses to include our IT courses to all students beginning at the Jr. High School level. All students will be presented with information about this course and the benefits that are included within. Our district will provide students, enrolled in this course, the opportunity to take the AP CSP exam free of charge. Additionally, we will provide these students the opportunity to receive additional AP CSP exam preparation during our district intersessions.

We will document the number of CTE completers that take an AP course during the 2022-2023 school year and compare them to the 2023-2024 CTE completers. This data will allow us to track the a) increase in students taking an AP course b) student participation and/or performance of students taking and/or passing the AP CSP exam and c) the number of special populations and non-traditional students enrolled in an AP CSP course. We will provide information and the benefits of
enrolling in the course to all of student population.

7. Describe how the LEA plans to implement and sustain the AP CSP course at each campus and how the course will continued to be offered beyond the grant.

Tornillo ISD plans to implement this course for the school year 2023-2024. The primary use of the grant will be to fund the tuition for our instructor to receive the necessary PD provided by PLTW. Funding will also be used to fund instructor pay for hours worked during training. Remaining funds will be used towards the purchase student PLTW program license usage. There after we will use Campus funds and district CTE allocated funding to purchase and sustain required student program license usage and AP CSP exam fees if grant funding does not continue.

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Goals, Objectives and Strategies

The goals of this program is to increase the capacity of our Information Technology Program of Study by providing our students the opportunity to enroll in an additional AP course. An additional AP course will give our students an additional opportunity to earn college credit with a qualifying score. Lastly, this will provide our students exposure to more Computer Science course work and will better prepare them for postsecondary degrees and career opportunities. Strategies and activities to meet our goals will include giving students the opportunities to receive further instruction and assistance during district intersessions. With the knowledge and experience our students will obtain while enrolled in this course, they will be eligible to participate in our practicum course. This will allow these students to work with our IT Department and utilize the knowledge acquired from the AP CSP course.
