For campuses implementing a TIP, the district will limit the number of district initiatives in which each campus is required to participate. The district administrative team meets monthly to ensure each campus has the resources needed and the flexibility to respond to barriers and challenges that may impede the implementation of the ESF Essential Actions focused in their aligned TIP. The DCSI will create performance management systems that allow for the collection of targeted data to evaluate progress in meeting school improvement goals and effective implementation of each focused EA. The data collected will inform the LEA on potential modifications to district practices and policies.
